## **BETHUNE CEMETERY HISTORY INFORMATION**

For much of the First World War, Bethune was comparatively free from bombardment and remained an important railway and hospital centre, as well as a corps and divisional headquarters. The 33rd Casualty Clearing Station was in the town until December 1917. Early in 1918, Bethune began to suffer from constant shell fire and in April 1918, German forces reached Locon, five kilometres to the north. The bombardment of 21 May did great damage to the town and it was not till October that pressure from the Germans was relaxed.

Bethune Town Cemetery contains 3,004 Commonwealth burials of the First World War, 11 being unidentified. This includes 26 men of the 1/8th Manchester Regiment who were killed by a bomb on 22 December 1917 while marching to rest billets. Second World War burials number 19, 2 being unidentified. There are also 122 French and 87 German war graves, 38 of the German burials are unidentified.

The Commonwealth section of the cemetery was designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens.

## **CEMETERY LOCATION**

Bethune is a town 29 kilometres north of Arras. The cemetery can easily be found, from any point in Bethune, by following the French signs indicating 'CIMETIERE NORD'. More precisely, head northwards from the Grand Place along the rue Sadi Carnot and Place Lamartine for about 450 metres. Just beyond the Tribunal, turn right into rue Arthur Lamendin and follow the road to the bottom of the hill (350 metres). Turn right into the cul-de-sac and the cemetery entrance can be found after 50 metres on your left hand side.

## BIOGRAPHY AND MILITARY SERVICE

Samuel Richards was the son of Thomas and Harriet (nee., Edwards) Richards and was born in Osgathorpe on the 1st of January 1892. The date of his birth meant that he wasn't shown on the 1891 census. In the 1891 census his father and mother are both aged 27. Thomas was a coal miner and was born in Worthington and Harriet was born in Copt Oak. Their three children at that time were Lillian (aged 6), Frederick W (3) and Rose H (10mths), all born in Osgathorpe. There were no Richards shown in the 1881 census, so Thomas and Harriet came to live in Osgathorpe some time between 1881 and 1891 but were there by 1885 as Lillian (6) was born in Osgathorpe. No Richards are shown in the 1901 census so the family had moved elsewhere, probably to their home in Church Lane, Whitwick by that time.

Samuel Richards enlisted on the 29th of August 1914 at Leicester. It is thought he was living at the family home in Whitwick at the time. He would have had at least 12 months training before he embarked for Boulogne on the 29th July 1915.

*Samuel fought with the 8th Battalion of the Leicestershire Regiment until he was wounded in the legs during an action to take the village of Guedecourt (a commune in the Somme department in the French region Picardie), on the 28th September 1916. He was transported to England where he was hospitalised for several months.*

### **AN EXTRACT FROM A RECORDED DESCRIPTION OF THE FIGHTING AROUND GUEDECOURT WHERE 105815 SAMUEL RICHARDS WAS WOUNDED IN THE LEGS**

Two battalions of the 110th Brigade on the left of the division, were caught by a German counter-barrage but found a gap in the defences of Bavarian Infantry Regiment 13, attacked the II Battalion from the rear and took Goat Trench. As the barrage stopped, the advance to the second objective was resumed, through well-cut wire but machine-gun fire from the right caused many casualties and stopped the advance short of Gird Trench. The forward troops were reorganised and a runner sent back to call on the reserve companies was wounded en route and the message was not delivered. **The 9th Leicester formed a defensive flank along a sunken part of "Watling Street" (the Ginchy-Gueudecourt road) on the right flank. A small number of troops of the 8th Leicester, who had got into Gird Trench held on and gained touch with the 165th Brigade of the 55th Division, which had taken Gird Trench in its area early in the afternoon.** Disorganisation along the 21st Division front and the great number of casualties among message runners, prevented the divisional headquarters from realising the situation and erroneous reports from observers convinced the headquarters that Gueudecourt had fallen. The British then gained a foothold in a sunken road between Gird Trench and Gueudecourt at 2:40 p.m.

FOLLOWING HIS RECOVERY IN THE UK**

*Once he recovered sufficiently he was reposted to France on the 17th March 1917 where he joined the 1st Battalion Leicestershire Regiment in the Loos sector. Samuel was wounded in early June and was stretchered to the 33rd Casualty Clearing Station where he succumbed to his wounds.*

**Coalville Times article - Friday June 29th, 1917**

Mr and Mrs Thomas Richards, of 150, Church Lane, Whitwick, have been notified by the War Office that their son, Pte. Samuel Richards, of the Leicestershire Regiment, died on June 10th from wounds received in action in France two days earlier. He was a single man, 25 years of age, and before the war worked at the Whitwick Colliery, where his father is employed. He joined up in August, 1914, and had been previously twice wounded, returning to the Front the last time in March last. He was an old boy of the Whitwick Church School.

His death was also reported in the **Leicester Daily Mercury - Tuesday 10 July 1917**
