THE FRONT COVER IMAGES

The original "Lord Kitchener Wants You" poster was a 1914 advertisement by Alfred Leete which was developed into a recruitment poster. It depicted Lord Kitchener, the British Secretary of State for War. Above the words "YOUR COUNTRY NEEDS YOU". Kitchener, wearing the cap of a British Field Marshal, stares and points at the viewer calling them to enlist in the British Army against the Central Powers. The image is considered one of the most iconic and enduring images of World War I.

BRITISH ARMY STATISTICS - 1914

At the beginning of 1914, the British Army had a reported strength of 710,000 men including reserves, of which around 80,000 were regular troops ready for war. By the end of the First World War almost 1 in 4 of the total male population of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland had joined up, over five million men. Of these men, 2.67 million joined as volunteers and 2.77 million as conscripts (although some volunteered after conscription was introduced and would most likely have been conscripted anyway).

Bienvillers Military Cemetery was begun in September 1915 by the 37th Division, and carried on by other Divisions in the line until March 1917, reopened from March to September 1918, when the village was again near the front line, **and completed in 1922-24 when a number of graves, mainly of 1916, were brought in from the battlefields of the Ancre.** Its twenty-one plots show a remarkable alternation of original burials in regimental or divisional groups, and groups of concentrated graves. The cemetery now contains 1,605 Commonwealth burials and commemorations of the First World War. 425 of the burials are unidentified but there are special memorials to two casualties known or believed to be buried among them. The 16 Second World War burials all date from the early months of the war, before the German invasion in May 1940 forced the evacuation of the British Expeditionary Force from France. Bienvillers is a large village in the department of the Pas de Calais 18 kilometres southwest of Arras.

Harry Toon's death is recorded on the Commonwealth War Graves Commission website and he is listed as being buried at **BEINVILLERS MILITARY CEMETERY** – Grave reference - I. A.71. **Toon is miss spelt as Toone in their records and on his gravestone.**

Little did Thomas Toon (aged 45), a coal miner, and his wife Annie (40) Toon (Nee Birkin) know the future tragedy that was to befall them after they moved to Griffydam sometime between 1901 and 1911 with their five sons Harry (16), Maurice (12), Thomas (10), John (9) and Fred (8) to live in one of the last cottages at the end of Elder Lane where it meets the Rempstone Road. Thomas and Annie were born in Melbourne and Newbold respectively and all the sons were born in Worthington. Harry (born April 1895) is shown on the 1911 census as a "Clay Worker - Pipe Works – Earthenware" (presumably at The Lount Brick and Sanitary Pipe Company, Newbold), but the following report of his death in the Coalville Times states that he worked at Coleorton Colliery, presumably Coleorton No.3. (Bug & Wink).

Harry was one of the volunteers that joined Kitchener's Army in 1914 at the young age of 19 when he enlisted at Coleorton hall on Sept 5th 1914 and was posted to the 9th Battalion Leicestershire regiment (service number 14853) which was raised at Leicester in September 1914 as part of Kitchener's third new army (K3). The 9th Battalion Leicestershire regiment joined the 23rd division as divisional troops. In April 1915 they transferred to the 11th brigade, 39th division. After many months training in various camps in England, they were mobilised for War and proceeded to France on the 29th of July 1915. The division, following trench warfare training in the area of Tilques, were then engaged in various actions on the Western Front where Harry Toon sadly lost his life.


It was only just over 18 weeks after the regiment arrived in France that Thomas and Annie received the devastating news that their son had been killed in battle. There follows a report from the Coalville Times:-

Coalville Times – Friday December 3rd 1915

GRIFFYDAM SOLDIER KILLED – A FORMER MINER AT COLEORTON COLLIERY

Mr & Mrs. Thomas Toon, of Griffydam, have received information that their son, Private Harry Toon (14853), 16th Platoon, D. Company, 9th Leicestershire Regiment, has been killed in action at a place not stated. The sad news was first received in a letter from Second-Lieutenant. V. W. Sheldon, who states that Toon was killed on November 15th. Private Toon was aged 20, and resided with his parents at Griffydam and worked at Coleorton Colliery. He and his two pals, Privates C. Platts and S. Johnson, enlisted at Coleorton Hall, on September 5th, 1914, and after training in various camps in England, landed "somewhere in France" on July 29th last.

According to the CWGC registration documents, Thomas and Annie Toone, where living at 334, Western Terrace, Coalville, Leicestershire, but these appear to be c.1920 when they were completed.

WHY ARE ALL THE LEICESTERSHIRE REGIMENTS REFERRED TO AS "THE TIGERS" ?

In 1825, the regiment which at that time was known as the "17th Foot", was given the honour of wearing the insignia of a tiger superimposed with the word "Hindoostan", in recognition of its long stint in India between 1804 and 1823. The regiment began to be popularly called the Tigers and the name has since stuck. All the Leicestershire regiments wore the badge below in various formats. The current Leicester Rugby Team took the name of "The Tigers"
